We need your help when you and other law makers vote on S. 519 which will decide our future. Without a change to the Hoover legislation, Mohave Electric Cooperative located in Bullhead City, AZ, and all members, will continue to be denied a share of low-cost, green power from Hoover Dam for 50 *more* years.

**Straight Talk about Hoover Dam Power Allocation S.519**

*Legislative change is needed to give Co-op members access to green, low-cost power*

**The facts:**

- **For more than 70 years**, federal legislation has denied Rural Electric Cooperatives access to an allocation of power generated at Hoover Dam.
- This discrimination will continue for **another 50 years** if the law is not changed before new federal contracts are awarded in 2017.
- S. 519 (the Hoover Power Allocation Act of 2011) is critically flawed in its detrimental impact on Rural Electric Cooperative members.
- S. 519 and its discriminatory provisions are currently in the hands of the U.S. Senate.
- S. 519 must be revised to give equal access to power generated from Hoover Dam, a Federal hydroelectric facility, to Rural Electric Cooperative members.
